Working Hard to be a Middle School Teacher

When you walk into Miss Irma’s Café – Alice Lloyd College’s campus hot-spot for specialty coffees, hot sandwiches, and wireless internet while you wait – you will most likely be greeted with a broad smile by Justin – the work-study student – who calls you by first name as you come through the door. In a small community like Pippa Passes, it’s not marketing – it’s simply Eastern Kentucky hospitality.

Justin began to dream of being a teacher years ago – when he was in grade school at Feds Creek Elementary in neighboring Pike County, Kentucky. You see, he had wonderful teachers who truly cared about him and his fellow students.
