Economics (Econ)

209 Principles of Economics I 3 credit hours

Microeconomics. Basic economic principles and their application to business in modern economy. Demand, supply, pricing, resource allocation of various competitive conditions and income distribution.

Prereq: Math 110 or higher. (Fall)

210 Principles of Economics II 3 credit hours

Macroeconomics. Economic principles as they apply to U.S. economy. National income, employment, financial institutions, monetary and fiscal policy, and theory of economic growth. Prereq: Math 110 or higher. (Spring)

330 Regional Economic Development 3 credit hours

A study of economic development and trends in the Appalachian Mountains. A major emphasis will be placed on the role of coal and its impact upon the regional and national economy. Prereq: Econ 209 or 210. (As needed)
