Overview

Completion of the following curriculum will satisfy the requirements for the Associate in Applied Science in Education degree at the Kentucky Community and Technical College System and leads to the Bachelor of Arts in Elementary Education at Alice Lloyd College. Service learning, character-based, and a leadership education model called the Purpose Road Philosophy are an important component of an ALC education.

The prospect of taking on no debt to cover your tuition makes ALC a popular choice for students to consider. Due to this unique model and promise, many students apply.

Admission Requirements

Upon completion of the Associate of Applied Science in Education degree as specified in the addendum, KCTCS graduates who meet admissions requirements and academic policies of Alice Lloyd College will be eligible for admission to the Bachelor degree program at ALC pursuant to this Agreement.

Students seeking admission to ALC must apply through the Office of Admissions and complete the following:

- A free application for admission ([Admissions - Alice Lloyd College \(alc.edu\)](https://alc.edu))
- Submit an official transcript of college credit from all colleges in which the student has enrolled, complete with final grades from the most recent term attended;
- Submit an official final high school transcript reflecting the graduation date;
- ACT and/or SAT scores, optional;
- Required interview with the Director of Admissions or Admissions Counselor; interview can be completed in-person on campus or virtually, and
- A completed Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Benefits Available to KCTCS Students Transferring to Alice Lloyd College

- Appalachian Leaders Scholarship – Tuition Guarantee – All enrolled students pay \$0 out-of-pocket toward tuition

- Geddes Scholarship – Additional \$500 per year scholarship to students transferring to ALC with at least a 3.0 GPA
- Caney Scholars Program – Financially assists qualified ALC graduates pursuing advanced degrees
- No application fees

Alice Lloyd Degree Requirements

In order to receive a bachelor's degree from Alice Lloyd College, a student must meet the following criteria:

- Achievement of at least a “C” grade in each course in the department of the major, minor, professional education, related studies and in collateral requirements. (Additional requirements for each major are specified.)
- Completion of a minimum of 128 semester hours. (30 of the last 36 semester hours must be taken in residence at ALC.)
- The ALC cumulative GPA must be at least a 2.00.
- Satisfactory completion of curriculum, Student Work Program hours, convocation attendance, and institutional and departmental assessment requirements.
- Participation in Baccalaureate and Commencement exercises.

Criteria for Admissions to the Teacher Education Program (TEP)

- Complete an application for the Teacher Education Program.
- Attain a cumulative 2.75 grade point average (4.00 scale) in all college academic work or 3.0 in the last 30 credit hours.
- Complete Educ 200, Educ 220, Eng 101, Eng 102; Comm 126; Math 110 or 112 or 113 or 125; CIS 110, all with a grade of “C” or better; and a total of 75 percent of all General Education and Institutional course requirements. Present satisfactory record of preprofessional curricula experiences.
- Demonstrate proficiency in communication, critical thinking, creativity, and collaboration.
- Review Professional Code of Ethics for Kentucky School Certified Personnel.
- Review character and fitness questionnaire.
- Demonstrate understanding of professional disposition of educators.
- Present two satisfactory recommendations from home community (non-relatives) and two former college instructors. Must also receive a satisfactory recommendation from the Director of the Student Work Program, if applicable.
- Exhibit moral, social, and ethical behavior commensurate with professional competency and evidence of no impairment that would preclude teaching success
- Submit a satisfactory criminal background check.
- Submit a negative drug test.
- Present satisfactory results on examinations as required by the TEP and the Education Professional Standards Board. (Please refer to the Teacher Education Handbook for further details.)
- Be interviewed and formally recommended by the Teacher Education Committee.
- Must satisfy the following conditions: A passing score on the CASE (reading 156, writing 162, math 150.)
- Must also achieve satisfactory results on other tests or evaluations as requested by the Teacher Education Committee.
- Students must be admitted to the teacher education program prior to the second semester of the junior year. Students who are denied admission into the Teacher Education Program may submit a written request for a hearing before the Teacher Education Committee for special consideration.

The Teacher Education Committee will appraise each teacher candidate as deemed necessary by the Director of Education. The Committee may recommend dismissal from the Teacher Education Program at any time that a student's social, academic, personal, or professional conduct is found to be unsuitable for the teaching profession.

Learning and behavior disorders dual certification is an added endorsement that can be added to Elementary Education P-5, Middle School Education 5-9, Mathematics Education 8-12, Biological Science Education 8-12, or Social Studies Education 8-12.

General Transfer Requirements

A student may transfer up to 90 credit hours from a regionally accredited KCTCS school toward a bachelor's degree program at Alice Lloyd College. Students must be in good standing when withdrawing from their former school and must have at least a 2.00 (C) academic average. Students transferring to ALC must earn a minimum of 38 credit hours (hours in residency required) at Alice Lloyd College to be awarded a degree.

Students must be in good standing with any former school(s) and must have at least a 2.00 (C) academic average. Alice Lloyd College will not transfer "D" grades. Transfer students who have earned a cumulative grade point average below 2.0 or those who have been dismissed previously from another institution of higher education may petition the ALC Vice President for Academic Affairs/Dean of the College for admission.

Tuition is guaranteed (covered) regardless of income for residents of 108 counties in Central Appalachia throughout five states (Kentucky, Ohio, West Virginia, Virginia, and Tennessee). Students from outside the 108-county service area can request the Appalachian Leaders Scholarship in writing by demonstrating their desire to attend ALC and how the scholarship would assist with their education. All enrolled students pay \$0 out-of-pocket toward tuition.
